



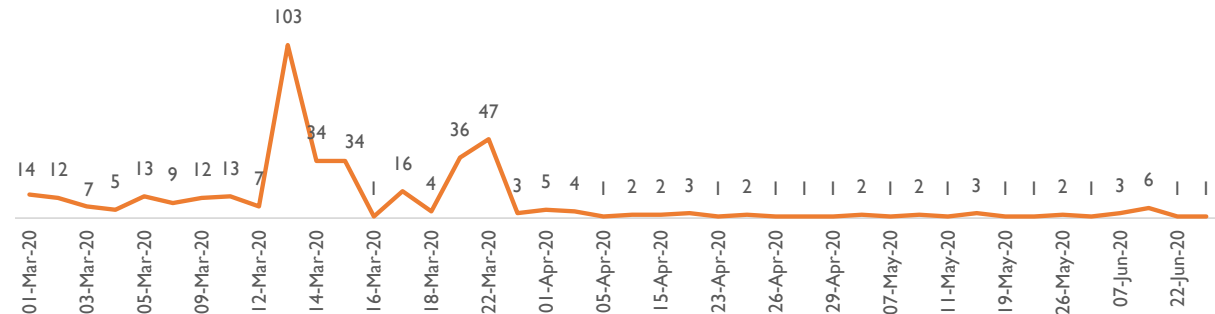
OVERVIEW

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) operates a Migration Response Centre (MRC) in Obock region in Djibouti, to assist migrants who wish to return to their countries of origin after attempts to emigrate or upon return from the Arab Peninsula. IOM Djibouti provides multi-sectoral assistance at the MRC in Obock, including food and non-food item assistance, health care and psychosocial support. Migrants also benefit from Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) assistance to their country of origin. However, IOM suspended AVRR services following the Djibouti-Ethiopia border closure due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In the context of COVID-19 prevention and in order to avoid overcrowding, the admission of new migrants at the Obock MRC was reduced to admitting the most vulnerable migrants only, namely women, children and sick migrants.

The peak of March 13 was due to the arrival of 103 migrants referred by the gendarmerie and whose boat had broken down before leaving for Yemen.

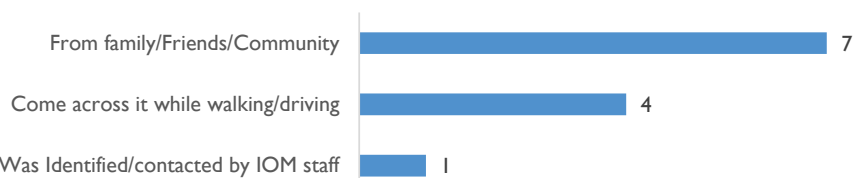

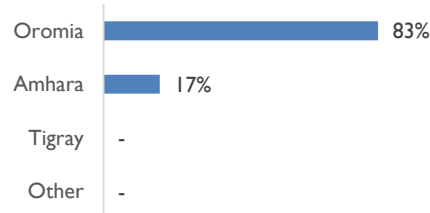

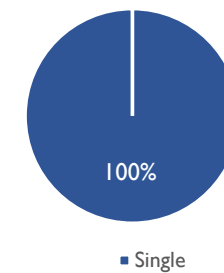

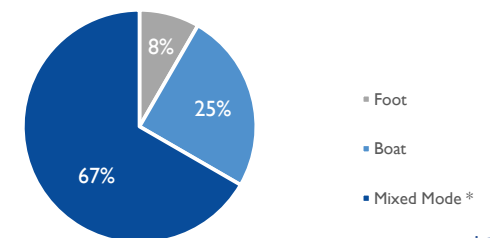

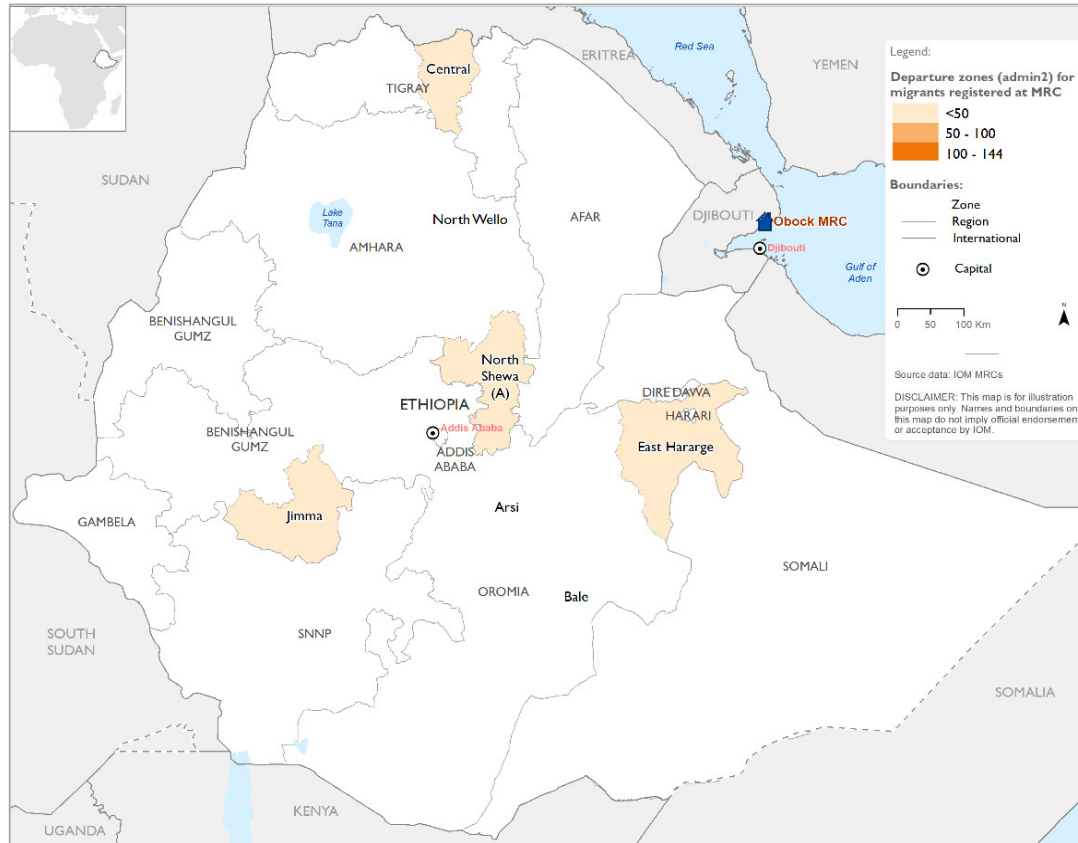

AWARENESS RAISING ON THE RISKS OF IRREGULAR MIGRATION

In Obock region, IOM sensitized 205 migrants (107 men and 98 women) on the risks of irregular migration and on the COVID-19 prevention. Sensitization took place in Khor Angar and at the MRC.
